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Stay Safe Policy

Introductory Statement:

This policy was devised in line with current recommendations and guidelines from the Child Protection Guidelines and Procedures (DES, 2017) and Children First (DCYA, 2017).

The Stay Safe Programme is a teaching programme designed for use in Irish primary schools. It was researched and developed by the Child Abuse Prevention Programme. The principal aim of the programme is to reduce vulnerability to child abuse and bullying through the provision of a personal safety education programme (staysafe.ie). Under Child Protection Guidelines, all schools are mandated to teach the Stay Safe programme. The revised Stay Safe Programme will be implemented in its totality in each class in the school.

Format

Stay Safe is taught as part of the SPHE (Social Personal and Health Education) curriculum. All classes are taught Stay Safe lessons. Lessons are taught in the second term of the school year as recommended. A teacher may decide to revisit topics at other times during the year if the need arises. As outlined in the programme guidelines, individual adaptations or supports will be put in place for certain pupils with special educational needs. Teacher's will date and document each lesson in their Cuntas Miosuil.
