We encourage all our girls and boys to join local clubs. Gerry from Ballymun Kickhams coaches here in OLV and he has a great way with the children. Our children, aged 4, 5, 6 and

7 are coached in 2 venues- St.Kevin's College Ballygall Road on Saturdays 9.30 to 10.30 and also in the grounds of Trinity Comprehensive School on Ballymun Road between 11 and 12 on Saturdays. Attend whichever venue suits you best. Just turn up wearing runners/football boots!

#### A Few Reminders to Help Everything Run Smoothly:-

Tracksuits are generally worn Monday, Wednesday and optional on Friday and uniform on Tuesday and Thursday. We are not overly fussy if a tracksuit is worn more often, especially as we are ventilating the rooms and weather getting cooler. <u>Clearly mark all your child's</u> <u>belongings, especially jumpers and sweatshirts.</u> From time to time, we may request that tracksuits should be worn e.g. science field trips to the park etc.

**School Hours are 9.00 a.m. to 1.45 p.m.** School doors open at 9.00 a.m. Junior Infants line up from 1.40. We ask that all parents enter the front gate for collection.Please allow your child to line up in the morning on his/her class line. Please stand behind the yellow line at home-time until the teachers signal a safe handover. Adults wear masks.

# Punctuality/Appointments/Early Collections

Punctuality, being on time, is a priority in our school for the benefit of each child and for smooth class dynamics. Please make appointments for your child outside school hours. It is important to keep disruption to a minimum. We are ever conscious of the security of the children in our care. Children should not be collected early from school except in an emergency. Teachers have been instructed that children may not be collected from classrooms during school hours without permission of the Principal or Deputy-Principal. This is a necessary precaution. Habitually arriving late and early collection of children adds up to a lot of education time missed. Late arrival and early collection times are recorded. Please continue to send an email to attendance@olvinfants.com if your child is sick (Child's name, Class number, Reason for absence). If your child has any Covid-19 symptoms, please keep him/her at home, in the interest of risk reduction.

In the interest of Health & Safety of children and adults alike, <u>no cycling or use of scooters</u> <u>or skates</u> in the school yard and grounds is allowed. <u>No dogs</u> apart from assistance dogs are allowed in the school yard and grounds. (There has been a problem with dog dirt in the yard). We have a family of foxes residing on the grounds -if you see fox dirt, please alert a member of staff. Our helpful traffic wardens have requested that both parents and children walk <u>in</u> <u>front</u> of the wardens. Always <u>keep left</u> of the new school pedestrian gates.

#### Lunches

In fairness to other children, *fizzy drinks, sweets, crisps* and *chocolate (including Nutella)* will be returned in the schoolbag, as we encourage the children to eat a healthy lunch. Due to allergies and cases of diabetes, no birthday cakes or treats are allowed in school. We are a <u>nut -free school, due to allergies. Please respect this. No nut products are to be included</u> in your child's lunchbox. We return food bags home so parents can monitor their child's <u>diet and to reduce our waste on site.</u>
