Critical Literacy & the Child's Voice

These are two areas that we will reflect on next year in our approach to teaching and learning and we will invite parents to do likewise. A school and home culture that encourages curiosity and wonder, querying and questioning will ensure critical thinking and problem solving skills. Ask open- ended questions- these are questions that do not have a "Yes" or "No" answer, but give opportunities for your child to express his/her ideas and thoughts. An example might be "What would you do if you found some magic beans?" "What might happen if a polar bear came into the house?" "Why did you decide to draw a seahorse?" etc.
